One of Asia's fastest racing cars, the MRF F2000 is powered by a 2-litre Mountune Duratec engine with max power of 230 BHP and shod on MRF Z.L.O. tyres.






THE CREW



CHASSIS

- The chassis has been designed by DALLARA according to the FIA technical and crash-test regulations
- The design of the carbon monocoque chassis is incorporated with front crash nosecone and rear impact structure
- Headrest protection is similar to current Dallara F3 cars
- A removable safety seat is fitted
- Wheel tethers are fitted
- Integrated fire extinguisher system
